From the Seven Churches

September often seems to me like a time of fresh starts and new challenges. My children, along with many others, return to school, and new classes are greeted with a mixture of eagerness and trepidation! Local clubs, groups and events may get going again after perhaps a short break or a sleepy August. This seems especially so this year as a remarkably hot and dry summer gives way to the plans and pre-occupations of autumn.

One of the groups planning ahead is the youth group which I am leading, called *Explorers*. It's been going for just over a year now and the monthly meetings are a mixture of games and exploring the Christian faith, together with some snacks and drinks! We have also enjoyed a couple of outings so far: a 'hike and hot dog' and a summer barbecue. When we meet in September, however, we will be looking to plan the year ahead and reflecting on a theme of boldness and courage. This is partly connected with the new challenges at school but also recognises that courage and boldness may be needed at many different times in life. It's always a joy to see how the children in the group explore some big questions with interest, humour and enthusiasm. How inspiring!

This theme was highlighted as well at the special confirmation service we held in August, where Bishop Dagmar spoke of the challenges those being confirmed would face in living out their faith in Jesus and how each would need the support and prayers of others. Bishop Dagmar also gave the example of the Bishop of the Amazon whom she met at the recent Lambeth conference, who took a boat along the Amazon River to visit congregations and faced many perils along the way. What courage and boldness she needed as she proclaimed faith, hope and love in her part of the world.

This confirmation service indeed reflects the encouragement St Paul gave to the church in Corinth when he wrote: "stand firm in the faith; be courageous; be strong" He also immediately added: "Do everything in love". How important it is to hold all of these things together! Whatever new challenges we may face in the different times and seasons of our lives, we too may draw upon this encouragement in living out faith, hope and love in our place and time.

Granta Update September 2022

Flu Clinics 2022

Now that we are all socialising again and there are questions about lower levels of immunity since lockdown, it is really important to get your flu vaccine. The dates of our clinics are as follows:-

- Saturday 24th September Sawston Medical Practice, CB22 3HU
- Saturday 1st October Linton Health Centre, CB21 4JS
- Sunday 2nd October Market Hill Surgery, SG8 9JN
- Saturday 8th October Shelford Health Centre, CB22 5FY
- Sunday 16th October Linton Health Centre, CB21 4JS
- Sunday 16th October Barley Surgery, SG8 8HY
- Friday 21st October Sawston Medical Practice, CB22 3HU
- Saturday 22nd October Shelford Health Centre, CB22 5FY

All clinics will run from 8.30am to 4pm.

We will be vaccinating:-

- all children aged 2 to 3 years on 31 August 2022
- people aged 65 years and over (including those becoming 65 by 31 March 2023
- those patients aged from 6 months to less than 65 years of age in a clinical risk group such as asthma, COPD, chronic heart problems, and diabetes. If you are unsure if you fit into an "at risk" group don't hesitate to ask
- pregnant women (including those women who become pregnant during the influenza season)
- household contacts of immunocompromised individuals, especially those for whom continuing close contact is unavoidable
- those in long stay residential care homes
- those who are carers
- those with a learning disability

The government are also extending the cohort to include those patients 50 years old and over with no underlying health conditions. However, these patients will be vaccinated later in the programme, most likely November time.

The vaccines we are using this year are:

For the 2 to 3 year olds – *Fluenz nasal spray*. This should arrive in time for us to vaccinate in our planned clinics.

For 18 to 64 year olds – *Flucelvax* and *Supemtek*. These are both egg-free and provide a better immune response than the traditional egg-based vaccines used in previous years. **For 65 years old and over** – *Fluad* (adjuvanted quadrivalent). This vaccine contains an immunity boost.

We hope that we will be able to give the Covid autumn boosters at the same time as the flu vaccines. We will keep you updated with any developments.

County and District Council District and County Councillors' Report August 2022 Local Plan Responses

The first draft of South Cambridgeshire District Council's local plan has now been commented upon by landowners, potential housing developers and members of the public. The Local Plan is a hugely important document as it dictates where houses can be built in the district over the next 30 years. The proposals were to concentrate all of the development into existing and forthcoming towns – such as Cambourne, Northstowe, Waterbeach New Town etc.

The consultation was an interesting exercise as it was the first opportunity for the land allocations to be officially challenged. This has produced 30 new proposals and 180 resubmissions of already rejected projects. The comments will be digested by the District Council and then a final proposal published – time frame TBC. As part of SCDC's Business Plan commitment to grow local businesses and economies, the Business Key Projects Team has been working with local traders, communities and businesses to help establish and expand local markets within the district. So far, we have explored how they are run, by whom, and whether they wish to grow. Additionally, we have gauged the mood for the potential setting up of new markets, meeting with groups, village hall users and independent stallholders.

Looking ahead past the six-month point

Officers recently wrote to hosts asking them to complete a survey indicating whether or not they plan to remain part of the Homes for Ukraine programme past the initial minimum six-month point. The data will help to plan for the next period. Of the responses so far, there is strong indication that many hosts are planning to continue to provide accommodation beyond the initial six-month point and we are grateful for this commitment. We are awaiting confirmation from Government on the next phase of the programme and as soon as we have clarity, we will let everyone know. In the meantime, we are working on how best we can provide support for guests who wish to move to alternative accommodation. Available support for Ukrainian guests

The monthly £350 host payment continues for a period of 12 months.

Grants of up to £300 are offered for events and activities to help reduce social isolation and encourage families to feel involved in their local community and life in Britain.

SCDC's free bike scheme is being expanded and more donations of bicycles are needed. TAG Bikes in Huntingdon is joining OWL bikes and Camtrust in the initiative. The scheme offers to each guest a free, fully refurbished cycle, with helmets, locks and a Bikeability cycle training course, which includes a translator.

Wild Minds invites young people from Ukraine to get involved in the Wild Minds courses which we run at two of the district's country parks. Designed to help improve mental health in young people through outdoor activities, it is supported by a Clinical Psychologist and offers free outdoor activities in small groups in a park setting to make the most of the natural environment.

Ukrainian Guests in Abington

There are now five households in Abington hosting 11 Ukrainian guests and one household awaiting guests. A new guest arrived in early July, is attending English classes and already has a job. Two guests arrived in August.

There are also 12 households in Abington that provide support to the hosts and guests.

There are potential guests in Ukraine wishing to come to the UK so, are there any households who would like to be hosts?

There is now a local network of support groups which interact via key contacts in Abington, Sawston/Pampisford, Stapleford, Shelford, Whittlesford, Duxford, Hinxton and Ickleton. These villages have 158 guests being hosted by 62 households. Nine more households are expecting 17 guests, A baby is also expected soon. Some of these support groups are arranging English classes and are also arranging activities to aid integration into the community. Contact has also been made with the Saffron Walden and Chesterford support groups. The Abington guests are becoming increasingly confident to travel to different locations as Ukrainian social contacts develop via the cooperating support groups.

Jennifer Hirsh - Died Sunday 14 August 2022

It is with great sadness that we have lost one of the founding members of the Abington History Group and a key member of the Abington Community - Jennifer Hirsh.

Jennifer was both a formidable and incredibly knowledgeable person involved in a very wide range of activities that had a major impact on both Little and Great Abington.

Jennifer was chairman of Little Abington Parish Council for over 20 years and retired in 2006, after helping the council secure "Quality Parish Council" status.

Her ability to organise and raise funds for village projects was inspiring, motivating groups of people to plan and drive projects through to completion.

Examples of this include:

- The Millennium Bridge across the river joining Little and Great Abington supported by TWI
- □ Refurbishment of the Village Institute
- □ Supporting the visit of 25 teenagers from Chernobyl as guests of the scout movement
- Planting of trees and recorder for Abington Naturewatch
- □ Restoration of the ford across the river and the village sign in the middle of the bridge
- Representations at the enquiries for the planned 'Out of Town Shopping Centre' at Fourwentways and dualling of the A11

As a founder member of the Abington History Group many of the projects were instigated, published, and shared with the local community through Jennifer's efforts including:

- Documenting the Parish Records and establishing a substantial image and map library
- Oral histories from elderly residents
- □ The Land Settlement Association and people in Abington 1936 to 1983
- World War II Memories of Abington and Abington People
- □ Village Trails describing many of the historic cottages in Abington.
- A booklet on the early 16th century cottage that was the Abington Pottery
- The 1603 John Norden map of Little Abington for which Jennifer organised a fundraising campaign enabling Cambridgeshire Archives to purchase this and four other maps at Sotheby's in May 2003
- A series of publications on Aspects of Abington History including an award-winning book covering changes over a 30-year period up to the sale of the Abington Hall estate in 1930.

Jennifer was awarded the British Association for Local History (BALH) Personal Achievement Award in 2021 for twenty years of devoted effort researching, documenting, and sharing the history of the villages of Great and Little Abington.

Many projects in the village would not have been achieved or even started had it not been for Jennifer's knowledge of the area, dedication, and persistence.

Jennifer will be greatly missed not only by the history group, but also by many Abington people and the village organisations in which she played a major role.

The findings of the 2021 Census are now published: www.ons.gov.uk/census. An interesting local statistic is population growth in South Cambridgeshire – it has increased by 8.9%, from around 148,800 in 2011 to 162,000 in 2021. This is higher than the overall increase for England (6.6%), where the population grew by nearly 3.5 million to 56,489,800.
